SUBJECT: Request approval of clean-up revisions to previous Board determinations (December 2012) under ACT 168, to clarify the existence of state park seasons already established by administrative rule.

FOR: June 2013 Board meeting

TO BE PRESENTED BY: Dan Schuller, Bureau Director, Wisconsin State Park System

SUMMARY:

The department requests approval of a package of clean-up revisions to the state park hunting framework previously adopted by the board. These revisions to existing policy are only for hunting opportunities which were already established by rule and in place prior to the enactment of 2011 ACT 168.

At its December 2012 meeting, the board adopted a plan for implementing 2011 ACT 168. The plan generally allows hunting and trapping at state park properties but restricts it to November 15 to December 15 and April through the end of the third spring turkey hunting season with an additional period for archery hunting only from December 16 through the Sunday nearest January 6.




At its December 2012 meeting, the board observed that there are some existing hunting opportunities offered at state parks which occur outside of the general framework adopted at the same meeting. The board requested department staff to review those hunting opportunities and return with a plan. Those additional opportunities are described in detail in the attached agenda.

Trapping had not been legal at state park properties prior to December 2012 NRB action. There are no changes to allowable trapping areas or seasons proposed in this package.

RECOMMENDATION: Approval of clean-up revisions to December 2012 Board determinations under ACT 168, to clarify the existence of state park seasons already established by administrative rule before December 2012.

SUBJECT: Clean up revisions to existing department policy for state park hunting opportunities which were already established by rule and in place prior to the enactment of 2011 Act 168.

The department requests approval of a package of clean-up revisions to the state park hunting framework previously adopted by the board. These revisions to existing policy are only for hunting opportunities which were already established by rule and in place prior to the enactment of 2011 Act 168.

Background:

At its December 2012 meeting, the board adopted a plan for implementing 2011 Act 168. The plan generally allows hunting at state park properties but restricts it to November 15 to December 15 and April through the end of the third spring turkey hunting season with an additional period for archery hunting only from December 16 through the Sunday nearest January 6.

At its December 2012 meeting, the board observed that there are some existing hunting opportunities offered at state parks which occur outside of the general framework adopted at the same meeting. The board requested department staff to review those hunting opportunities and return with a plan.

Trapping had not been legal at state park properties prior to December 2012 NRB action. There are no changes to allowable trapping areas or seasons proposed in this package.

Recommendations:

The department recommends clarifying that the following hunting opportunities, which are established by administrative rule, be adopted as part of the board's policy on hunting in state parks. Under this action, the Department recommends reaffirming the hunting opportunities that exist in rule, with the season structures and property areas outlined below. Related citations in administrative code are provided in Appendix 1.

Mirror Lake State Park – Previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168, hunting had been allowed for all migratory game birds under the season framework and hunting hours established by Departmental regulations. Hunting was allowed from November 1 to December 15 for small and upland game animals such as ruffed grouse, pheasants, quail, crows, squirrels, rabbits, fox, coyote, and raccoons but only until noon. Under this proposal, migratory game bird hunting would continue to be allowed at Mirror Lake State Park consistent with the season framework and hunting hours established by Departmental regulations. Small game hunting would continue to be allowed beginning on November 1 and continuing through December 15; however, from November 1 through November 14, small game hunting would end at noon. From November 15 through December 15, small game hunting hours would conform to those established under published small game hunting regulations. The Department recommends reinstating the previously allowable hunting areas for the period beginning November 1 through November 14 as indicated below.

Mill Bluff State Park - Previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168, hunting had been allowed

from November 1 to December 15 for ruffed grouse, pheasants and bobwhite quail but only until noon. In addition, at Mill Bluff State Park, the normal statewide fall turkey hunting season, including hunting hours, was offered. Under this proposal, small game hunting would continue to be allowed beginning on November 1 and continuing through December 15; however, from November 1 through November 14, hunting would end at noon. From November 15 through December 15, small game hunting hours would conform to those established under published small game hunting regulations. The Department recommends reaffirming the previously allowable hunting areas for the period beginning November 1 through November 14 as indicated below. Further, the Department recommends reaffirming the previously allowable fall turkey hunting season as allowed previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168.

Governor Dodge State Park - Previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168, hunting had been allowed from November 1 to December 15 for ruffed grouse, pheasants and bobwhite quail but only until noon. In addition, Governor Dodge State Park offered archery deer hunting beginning on the Thursday nearest October 15 and continuing through the Sunday nearest January 6. Under this proposal, small game hunting would continue to be allowed beginning on November 1 and continuing through December 15; however, from November 1 through November 14, hunting would end at noon. From November 15 through December 15, small game hunting hours would conform to those established under published small game hunting regulations. In addition, the Department recommends reaffirming archery deer hunting beginning on the Thursday nearest October 15 and continuing through the Sunday nearest January 6. The Department recommends reaffirming the previously allowable hunting areas for the period beginning November 1 through November 14 as indicated below, and for archery deer hunting as indicated.

High Cliff State Park – Previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168, High Cliff State Park had been open to muzzleloader hunting only during the traditional 9-day firearm season. Approval of this agenda item would reaffirm the muzzleloader-only regulation. The December 2012 board action proposed that this park would be archery only, which is in conflict with established administrative rules.

Peninsula State Park – Previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168, Peninsula State Park had been open to muzzleloader hunting only during the traditional 9-day firearm season. Approval of this agenda item would reaffirm the muzzleloader-only regulation. The December 2012 board action proposed that this park would be archery only, which is in conflict with established administrative rules.

Harrington Beach State Park - This park has a 19 day muzzleloader-only season beginning on the same day that the traditional statewide firearm season opens. Approval of this agenda item would reaffirm the muzzleloader-only regulation as allowed previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168.

Rib Mountain State Park - This park has a 19 day muzzleloader-only season beginning on the same day that the traditional statewide firearm season opens. Approval of this agenda item would reaffirm the muzzleloader-only regulation as allowed previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168. The Department also recommends the adoption of the map attached below.

Kohler Andrae State Park - This park has a 19 day muzzleloader-only season beginning on the same day that the traditional statewide firearm season opens. Approval of this agenda item would reaffirm the muzzleloader-only regulation as allowed previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168.

Wildcat Mountain State Park - This park has a 19 day muzzleloader-only season beginning on the same day that the traditional statewide firearm season opens. Approval of this agenda item would reaffirm the muzzleloader-only regulation as allowed previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168.

Perrot State Park - This park has a 9 day muzzleloader-only season beginning on the same day that the traditional statewide firearm season opens. Approval of this agenda item would reaffirm the muzzleloader-only regulation as allowed previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168.

Big Bay State Park -- Previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168, Big Bay State Park offered archery deer hunting beginning on the Thursday nearest October 15 and continuing through the Sunday nearest January 6. Approval of this agenda item would allow archery hunting to begin on October 15 and conclude the Sunday nearest January 6 at this property.

Blue Mound State Park -- Blue Mound State Park is located in the CWD management zone. Previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168, Blue Mound State Park offered archery deer hunting beginning on the Thursday nearest October 15 and continuing through the Sunday nearest January 6. Approval of this agenda item would reaffirm archery deer hunting beginning on the Thursday nearest October 15 and continuing through the Sunday nearest January 6.

Tower Hill State Park- Tower Hill State Park is located in the CWD management zone. Previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168, Tower Hill State Park offered archery deer hunting beginning on the Thursday nearest October 15 and continuing through the Sunday nearest January 6. Approval of this agenda item would reaffirm archery deer hunting beginning on the Thursday nearest October 15 and continuing through the Sunday nearest January 6.

Sugar River State Trail -- Previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168, this trail had been open to hunting deer and small game from the Saturday nearest October 17 to January 31 under the season framework and hunting hours established by Departmental regulations. Approval of this agenda item would reaffirm the deer and small game hunting opportunities as allowed previous to NRB action to implement 2011 Act 168.

Fall season beginning on the Saturday nearest September 15 and continuing through the Thursday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday.

Wild turkey hunting zones 1-5, as described in s. NR 10.29 and the Mill Bluff state park portion of zone 1, **excluding all other state parks**, for which a quota has been established under s. NR 10.25 (5).

Fall season beginning on the Monday immediately following the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing through December 31.

3. Zones 1A, 1B, 1C, 1D, 1E, 1F, 2A, 3A, 4A, 4B, 4C the Mill Bluff state park portions of zone 1 and the Glacial Heritage Area state park portions of zone 2 as described in s. NR 10.29.

Spring season beginning on the Wednesday nearest April 13 and continuing Tuesday of the following for 3 consecutive 7-day time periods.

Note: Glacial Heritage Area state park lands may be leased to another unit of government for management purposes and access permits to hunt turkeys on those lands would be obtained from that unit of government.

4. **Youth turkey hunt.**

a. Persons under the age of 16 years of age who possess a valid carcass tag issued for the current license year, and all necessary ch. 29, Stats., approvals may hunt turkeys for **2 consecutive days** starting on the Saturday immediately preceding the beginning of the spring turkey hunting season established in subd. 1. in the turkey management zone for which the carcass tag was issued.

(g) *Crow*

2. Governor Dodge, Mill Bluff and Miller Lake state parks.

Beginning on Nov. 1 and continuing through the Thursday immediately preceding the gun deer season
NR 10.01 Open and closed seasons.

(3) UPLAND GAME ANIMALS

(a) Gray and fox squirrels

2. Governor Dodge, Mill Bluff and Mirror Lake state parks. **Nov. 1 – Dec. 15.**

(bt) Raccoon (state park resident and non-resident hunting)

Governor Dodge, Mill Bluff and Mirror Lake state parks. **Nov. 1 – Dec. 15.**

(c) Cottontail, jackrabbit and snowshoe hare

1. Snowshoe hare

a. Governor Dodge, Mill Bluff and Mirror Lake state parks. **Nov. 1 – Dec. 15.**

b. Governor Dodge, Mill Bluff and Mirror Lake state parks. **Nov. 1 – Dec. 15.**

(e) Gun deer season.

2. State parks and forests. No person may hunt deer with a firearm on the state-owned portions of state parks and recreation areas except as provided in this section.

Portions of the properties listed may be posted closed to deer hunting. Additionally, no person may hunt deer with a firearm without first obtaining a permit which authorizes access to the park, in:

Muzzleloading firearm season beginning on the Saturday preceding the Thanksgiving holiday for **9 days.**

d. **Rib Mountain (unit 57D), Harrington Beach (unit 69C) and Kohler-Andrae (77E) state parks.**

Muzzleloading firearm season beginning Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving for **19 days.**

h. **Wildcat Mountain (unit 72A) state park.**

Muzzleloading firearm season beginning Saturday immediately preceding Thanksgiving for **19 days.**

(em) Deer bow season

b. Big Bay state park.

Beginning on Oct. 15 and continuing for the remainder of the early archery season and the entire late archery season described in subd. 1.

(et) *Special disease control hunts.*

d. Blue Mound, Governor Dodge and Tower Hill state parks.

1. **Early firearm season.** A firearm deer hunt beginning on the Thursday nearest October 15 and continuing for 4 consecutive days. Allowable types of firearms are those authorized on the first day of the gun deer season under s. NR 10.01 (3) (e). Legal hunting hours are those established in s. NR 10.06 (5) except that hunting hours shall close at 12:00 p.m. daily.

This season above is superceded by 29.016 Department authority; deer hunting seasons and license restrictions.

2. **Gun deer season.** A firearm deer hunt beginning on the Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for 9 consecutive days. Allowable types of guns are those authorized on the first day of the regular gun deer season in the surrounding county under s. NR 10.01 (3) (e).

3. **Muzzleloader season.** A muzzleloader hunt as established in s. NR 10.01 (3) (es) beginning on the Monday immediately following the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for 10 consecutive days.

4. **Late firearm season.** A firearm deer hunt beginning on the second Thursday following the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for 4 consecutive days. Allowable types of guns are those authorized on the first day of the regular gun deer season in the surrounding county under s. NR 10.01 (3) (e).

5. Archery season. An archery hunt beginning on the **Thursday nearest October 15** and continuing for 4 consecutive days. Legal hunting hours are the same as those established in s. NR 10.06 (5) except that hunting hours will close at 12:00 p.m. daily.

Beginning on the day immediately following the 4-day antlerless hunt above and continuing through the Wednesday immediately prior to the opening of the late firearm season in this section.

Beginning the second Thursday following the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for 4 days.

Beginning on the day immediately following the 4-day antlerless hunt above and continuing through the Sunday nearest January 6.

(ev) **Special youth gun deer hunt event.**

Persons under 16 years of age may hunt deer with a firearm for 2 consecutive days beginning on the Saturday nearest October 8 in all deer management units, **except state park units** and deer management unit 48.

(f) Fox, all species

2. **Governor Dodge, Mill Bluff and Mirror Lake state parks.**

Nov. 1 - Dec. 15.

(h) Coyote

1. Hunting

b. Governor Dodge, Mill Bluff and Mirror Lake state parks.

NR 10.275 State park small game and migratory game bird hunting.

No person may hunt game species listed in s. NR 10.01 (1), (2) (a), (c), (e), (g), (3) (a), (bt), (c), (f) or (h) on the state owned portions of state parks except as provided in this section. Portions of the properties listed may be posted closed to small game and migratory bird hunting.

(1) SMALL GAME AND MIGRATORY GAME BIRD HUNTING SEASONS.

(a) *Small game.* Hunting is allowed for small game in **Governor Dodge, Mill Bluff and Mirror Lake state parks** during the seasons specified in s. NR 10.01 (2) (a), (c), (e), (g), (3) (a), (bt), (c), (f) and (h).

(b) *Migratory game birds.*

1. Migratory game bird hunting for the species specified in s. NR 10.01 (1) is allowed in **Governor Dodge and Mill Bluff state parks** from **November 1 through December 15** or until the seasons established in s. NR 10.01 (1) conclude, whichever occurs first.

2. Migratory game bird hunting is allowed in **Mirror Lake state park** during the seasons specified in s. NR 10.01 (1).

(3) PERMITS AND REGISTRATION GENERAL PROHIBITIONS.

(a) No person may hunt small game or migratory game birds in **Governor Dodge, Mill Bluff and Mirror Lake state parks** without first obtaining a permit issued by the department.


(b) No person may hunt without first providing information in writing required by the department at a designated location at the state park property.

NR 11.12 State trail closed areas. A closed season is established on the following areas as posted with department signs. No person may hunt or trap any species of wild animal thereon beginning February 1 and continuing through the Friday preceding the Saturday nearest October 17, both dates inclusive.





Big Bay State Park Hunting and Trapping Map







Hunting Map (for dates ~Oct. 15 - Nov. 14)






Hunting and Trapping Map (for dates Nov. 15 - Jan. 6 and April 1 - May 3)
