

Special Information about Invasive Species and Your Grant



Any project that includes habitat restoration, soil movement, outdoor recreation, water usage, or habitat management may encounter invasive species. Invasive species are nonnative plants, animals, and organisms that cause environmental or economic harm. The Invasive Species Rule (Wis. Adm. Code Chapter NR 40) makes it illegal to possess, transport, transfer, or introduce certain invasive species in Wisconsin. Please become familiar with Chapter NR 40, the regulated species, and how the rule may impact your program.

Review the regulated species lists before initiating any planting or restoration projects. Do not use any regulated seeds or species.
