


Accessing the Audio Tour is Easy!



Explore Glacial Landscapes

The Kettle Moraine State Forest - Northern Unit preserves impressive examples of retreating glacial landforms from the last Ice Age. Because of these world-renowned features, the Northern Unit is included as one of nine units in the Ice Age National Scientific Reserve.

Explore the many recreation areas of the Northern Unit to experience the diverse examples of glacial landforms. Appreciate an esker at Parnell Tower, a kettle at Greenbush, a moraine at New Fane, or the Jersey Flats outwash plain on the Lake to Lake Trail.

We hope you enjoy your visit to the Kettle Moraine State Forest – Northern Unit.

Would you like to explore the unique glacial terrain of the Summit Nature Trail with your own naturalist guide?

Try the trail's audio tour! User friendly MP3 players loaded with the tour are available for loan. The tour features eight interpretive signs with corresponding audio stops. Learn how the glaciers shaped this landscape, leaving behind unique landforms like kettles, eskers, and drumlins.

Be prepared for steep climbs, descents, and stairs on this meandering one-mile trail loop. Begin the hike near campsite #944 in the Long Lake Recreation Area.


